
# PLACEMAKING ON BROADWAY GREATER BROADWAY DISTRICT SACRAMENTO, CA





### **PURPOSE**

THE OBJECTIVE OF THIS PLACEMAKING FRAMEWORK PLAN IS TO ENHANCE THE UNIQUE **CHARACTER** OF BROADWAY, ONE OF THE MOST POPULAR CORRIDORS IN SACRAMENTO. THROUGH PLACEMAKING ELEMENTS SUCH AS **GRASSROOTS ART PROJECTS**, TEMPORARY OR PERMANENT **COMMUNITY GATHERING**, CUSTOM **SITE FURNISHINGS**, AND **LANDSCAPE RENOVATIONS**, BROADWAY HAS THE POTENTIAL TO BECOME A MORE **ACTIVE AND INVITING PEDESTRIAN THOROUGHFARE**.

### WHAT IS PLACEMAKING?

PLACEMAKING IS THE PROCESS IN WHICH THE HEART OF A COMMUNITY IS RE-IMAGINED AND REINVIGORATED IN ORDER TO STRENGTHEN THE CONNECTION BETWEEN THE PEOPLE AND PUBLIC SPACES. PLACEMAKING IS A COLLABORATIVE PROCESS BY WHICH WE CAN SHAPE OUR PUBLIC REALM IN ORDER TO MAXIMIZE SHARED VALUE, PAYING SPECIAL ATTENTION TO THE PHYSICAL, CULTURAL AND SOCIAL IDENTITIES THAT DEFINE A PLACE AND SUPPORT ITS ONGOING EVOLUTION. THIS MAY INCLUDE ART INSTALLATIONS, TEMPORARY OR PERMANENT GATHERING SPACES, MURALS CREATED BY LOCAL ARTISTS OR SIDEWALK TREATMENTS SUCH AS STREET TREE REPLACEMENT, VEGETATIVE SCREENING OR IMPLEMENTATION OF CIVIL AMENITIES (TRASH RECEPTACLES, BENCHES, ETC.).

### WHAT IS THE GREATER BROADWAY DISTRICT?

THE GREATER BROADWAY DISTRICT IS SACRAMENTO'S MOST VIBRANT AND DIVERSE BUSINESS CORRIDOR. WITH A VARIETY OF RETAIL AND COMMERCIAL ENTERPRISES AS WELL AS A PLEASING VARIETY OF HISTORIC ARCHITECTURE, ETHNIC AND MAINSTREAM RESTAURANTS AND FUN SHOPPING. THE DISTRICT IS COMPRISED OF THREE SUB-DISTRICTS: THE MARINA, TOWER AND UPPER BROADWAY DISTRICT. FOR THE PURPOSES OF THE PLACEMAKING FRAMEWORK PLAN, THE FOCUS WILL BE PLACED ON THE **TOWER DISTRICT** WHICH RESIDES BETWEEN **RIVERSIDE BLVD** AND **21ST STREET**.






# PLACEMAKING RECOMMENDATIONS

PLACEMAKING RECOMMENDATIONS ARE SORTED BY FOUR CATEGORIES: SITE FURNISHINGS, LANDSCAPE RENOVATIONS, ART PLACEMENTS & COMMUNITY GATHERING SPACES. THESE RECOMMENDATIONS ARE MEANT TO WORK IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE COMPLETE STREET PROJECT IN ORDER TO ENLIVEN THE CORRIDOR AND RESTORE SOME OF THE CORE QUALITIES OF BROADWAY THAT HAVE MADE IT SO ICONIC.

As an effort to identify potential PLACEMAKING opportunities along Broadway corridor and develop a more accurate assessment of the community's priorities, ATLAS hosted a Community Engagement Workshop in conjunction with the Greater Broadway District Partnership. During this community meeting, ATLAS introduced the concept of PLACEMAKING to attendees and presented suggestions for Placemaking elements along Broadway. 




### AREAS OF INTEREST AS INDICATED BY QUESTIONNAIRE PARTICIPANTS:




### AREAS FOR CHANGE AS INDICATED BY QUESTIONNAIRE PARTICIPANTS:






### WHAT DO YOU DISLIKE ABOUT THE AREAS YOU WISH WOULD IMPROVE ON BROADWAY?

### **COMMUNITY WORKSHOP CONCLUSION**

Based on the collected data and feedback from the community workshop, ATLAS LAB arrived to the following conclusions:

### AREAS THAT SHOULD BE A PRIORITY AND BECOME A FOCAL POINT BASED ON INTEREST EXPRESSED BY COMMUNITY:

- 1. Tower Theater and Cafe
- 2. Target
- 3. Storefronts between 16th and 18th streets
- 4. Avid Reader

### AREAS THAT SHOULD BE CHANGED OR IMPROVED ACCORDING TO COMMUNITY INPUT:


- 1. Broadway Station
- 2. 18th and Broadway Vacant Lot
- 3. NW Corner of Target Parking Lot
- 4. 16th and Broadway Intersection

### **ACTION ITEMS:**

- Create a landscape renovation plan to add more tree canopy and greenery to Broadway Corridor, especially in areas of interest or change.
   Plants that provide shade should take precedence.
- Determine locations for murals. West Facade of Tower Theater, Bank of America, and XO Bar and Grill were the locations that obtained the highest percent of community support. Community members also expressed their concern about having murals on brick walls. They rather keep those walls as they are since they add to the character of Broadway.
- Determine location for art placement along Broadway. Prioritize most voted areas of interest or change. Commission local artists to create artwork and murals.
- Determine location for new street furnishings. According to feedback, community members wish to have access to more seating benches, trash cans, water fountains for drinking, and more public lighting.
- Address more in detail placemaking strategies for the Broadway Station area.
- Select a location where to design and implement a community gathering area, whether it will be permanent or temporary will depend on conditions of specific site.



# **MASTER PLAN**



### RIVERSIDE - 13th ST.



The empty tree planter on the south side of Broadway is in need of a replacement. The planters that run half the length of the block along the Target are bare and could benefit from drought tolerant plantings.



The trash accumulation near the covered bus stop and the bus bench opposite on the northern side of Broadway indicates a need for a trash receptacle.



The underutilized space in the Target parking lot has the opportunity to be activated for a permanent or temporary gathering space.



The bare vine cables along the wall of Target are excellent opportunities for string art or other art installations.

# 13TH - 14TH



The lawn space outside of Asian Food Center has the potential to be revitalized through the implementation of drought tolerant plantings.



The facade of the Asian Food Center is a prime opportunity for mural art in order to bring color to



Considering the lack of outdoor seating on this block, bench placement next to the existing trash receptacle is recommended.

# 14TH - 15TH



The bare corner at the intersection of 14th and Broadway could benefit from street trees to enliven the space while providing shade cover for parking.



The wall of the XO Lounge has excellent visibility and would be a great space for a mural. The west facing facade of the Tower Theatre could utilize hanging art to increase exposure while the utility boxes near the entrance of the parking lot are potential canvases for street art.



The bus stop is in need of a replacement trash receptacle.

### 15TH - 16TH



The hedge row in front of Tower Liquor is an excellent opportunity for an improved plant palette to bring more visual intrigue to a vital




The walls of t Japanese restaurant and Bank of America provide more opportunities for mural art while the utility box on the corner of the block has potential for beautification.



The sidewalk area in front of Bank of America provides ample space for the much needed bench and trash receptacle, which is absent on the entire block.

### 16TH - 17TH



The intriguing forms of the planters outside Dimple Records lend themselves to host art installations that may play off the theme of its historical surroundings.



The block is in need of a bike rack, locate new bike rack near the corner of the new construction that will soon be finished. Also, outside seating as well as a trash receptacle are missing from the block so it is recommended that these site furnishings be placed under the shade trees in front of Chase as there is ample space.

# 17TH - 18TH



It is recommended that the bare, unkempt walls be activated through mural art by local artists to bring additional color to the corridor. Furthermore, the chain-link fence next to Kathmandu Kitchen could benefit from simple art treatments to increase visual intrigue.



The bus benches on the northern and southern side of the corridor would benefit greatly from trash receptacles in order to reduce trash on the site.



A replacement tree outside the storefronts on the south side of Broadway is essential to maintain shade cover.

### 18TH - 19TH



The areas on the north side of Broadway are unkempt and in need of vegetation. The parking lot on the south side of Broadway would benefit greatly from vegetative screening and trees for shade.



The vacant lot proves to be an eye-sore for the area and has the potential to host a space that the larger community could benefit from.



The bare wall on the south side of Broadway and the chain-link fence of the vacant lot are excellent opportunities for art.



A bench, trash receptacle and bike rack are missing on this block and are recommended.

## 19TH - 20TH



The bus station next to AutoZone is need of a trash receptacle as made evident by the trash that litters the space. While the opposite side of the street is need of a replacement bench and trash receptacle.



The ample sidewalk space on the south side of Broadway provides a great opportunity for street trees. Also, the broken brick wall outside the Avid Reader is in need of repair.



The wall of The Catholic Store and the adjacent large utility box are great opportunities for art placement, especially next to the barren landscape of the railroad tracks.

### 20TH - 21ST



The vacant lots with the chain-link fences on both sides of Broadway would benefit greatly from the implementation of art to increase visual intrigue.



Trash receptacles near the Southern vacant lot and the bus stop on the North side of the street are recommended due to the high accumulation of trash near those areas.



A replacement street tree is recommended outside the storefronts on the south side of Broadway.

# PLACEMAKING RECOMMENDATIONS

# **STREET FURNISHINGS**

IMPLEMENTING STREET FURNISHINGS INCLUDING TRASH RECEPTACLES, BENCHES AND BIKE RACKS ARE SIMPLE YET EFFECTIVE WAYS TO IMPROVE THE FUNCTIONALITY OF THE DISTRICT WHILE ALLOWING FOR VISUALLY STRIKING ELEMENTS ALONG THE CORRIDOR.



### **BENCHES**

### **EXISTING BENCHES (QTY: 10)**

TYPICALLY UNKEMPT AND AESTHETICALLY INCONSISTENT, THE BENCHES OF BROADWAY ARE FAR AND FEW BETWEEN. BUS STOPS PROVIDE THE ONLY OUTDOOR SEATING THAT THE CORRIDOR HAS TO OFFER, DEMONSTRATING A NEED FOR IMPROVEMENT.

### A PROPOSED BENCHES (QTY: 9)

IMPLEMENTING DURABLE, EASILY MAINTAINED AND AESTHETICALLY UNIFORM BENCHES ALONG BROADWAY HAS THE POTENTIAL TO MAKE THE OUTDOOR SEATING PLEASANTLY AESTHETIC AND EASILY RECOGNIZABLE.

### TRASH RECEPTACLES

### EXISTING TRASH RECEPTACLES AND TRASH 'HOTSPOTS' (QTY: 9)

THE TRASH RECEPTACLES ON BROADWAY ARE SCARCE AND IN NEED OF AESTHETIC IMPROVEMENT. TRASH RECEPTACLES ARE GENERALLY DAMAGED AND UNNOTICEABLE. TRASH 'HOTSPOTS' ARE COMMON ALONG BROADWAY, POINTING TO THE NEED FOR MORE TRASH RECEPTACLES.

THE TRASH RECEPTACLES ALONG BROADWAY SHOULD NOT ONLY BE PLACED MORE FREQUENTLY IN ORDER TO INCREASE LEVELS OF UTILIZATION BUT SHOULD ALSO BRING COLOR AND DESIGN IDENTITY TO THE DISTRICT.

BIKE RACKS ALONG BROADWAY ARE CLUSTERED IN A FEW AREAS WHILE OTHER AREAS ARE LEFT BARE. ALTHOUGH SUFFICIENT, AESTHETIC IMPROVEMENTS TO THESE FURNISHINGS CAN BE INEXPENSIVE AND EFFECTIVE.




### O PROPOSED BIKE RACKS (QTY: 3)



# LANDSCAPE-BASED RECOMMENDATIONS

# **GATHERING SPACES**

THROUGH COMMUNITY LED ACTIVATIONS, VACANT LOTS ALONG BROADWAY HAVE THE POTENTIAL TO HOST A RANGE OF TEMPORARY ACTIVITIES THAT SUPPORT LOCAL BUSINESSES WHILE CREATING FUN AND FAMILY FRIENDLY EXPERIENCES.

### OPPORTUNITY FOR ACTIVATION

THE UNDERUTILIZED SPACE AT THE ENTRANCE OF THE TARGET PARKING LOT PROVIDES AMPLE SPACE FOR TEMPORARY EVENTS OR ART INSTALLATIONS. ITS LOCATION ON THE CORNER OF RIVERSIDE AND BROADWAY PROVIDES EXCELLENT VISUAL ACCESS AND THE OPPORTUNITY FOR A COMMUNITY GATHERING SPACE. THE ACTIVATION OF THIS VACANT LOT MAY TAKE THE FORM OF A SPACE WHERE THE LOCAL COMMUNITY CAN GATHER TO ENJOY ARTISAN COFFEE OR FOOD TRUCKS, OUTDOOR SEATING, TEMPORARY YET VIBRANT PLANTINGS AND INTERACTIVE ART INSTALLATIONS.

THE VACANT LOT ON THE CORNER OF 18TH AND BROADWAY IS UNKEMPT AND HAS AN APPEARANCE OF BEING ABANDONED YET HAS THE POTENTIAL TO BE A UNIFYING SPACE FOR THE DISTRICT. IF USED EFFECTIVELY, THE SPACE CAN PROVIDE THE COMMUNITY AND LOCAL BUSINESSES WITH A GATHERING SPACE TO ATTRACT PEOPLE TO THE DISTRICT. WHETHER THROUGH THE IMPLEMENTATION OF TEMPORARY BOCCE COURTS OR PLAY STRUCTURES, THE SPACE CAN BE BETTER UTILIZED TO ENGAGE LOCAL RESIDENTS WHILE PROMOTING SURROUNDING BUSINESSES.
